CLASSIFICATION & HANDICAPPING

NEW SHOOTER:

Singles—Class B if less than 500 PITA singles targets.

Doubles—Class B if less than 200 PITA doubles targets.

Handicap—20 yards for all shooters except Lady and Sub-Junior categories which start at 18 yards. Male Sub-Juniors advance to 20 yards upon their 15th birthday unless the average on their last 800 handicap targets is less than 89%, in which case they move to the 19 yard line.

ATA SHOOTER JOINING PITA:

Singles—current ATA average if they have shot a minimum of 500 ATA singles targets otherwise see “new shooter” section above.

Doubles—current ATA average if they have shot a minimum of 200 ATA doubles targets otherwise see “new shooter” section above.

Handicap—yardage equal to their ATA yardage if joining PITA for the first time. If the shooter has not registered any targets with the ATA in the current or past 2 years the shooter will be assigned yardage that is up to two yards less than the shooter’s prior ATA yardage, but not less than the minimum yardage for the special category or 20 yards for all others.

ESTABLISHED PITA SHOOTER:

Singles—On average beginning with at least 500 PITA singles targets—then on an increasing total until 1,000 targets—then on the last 1,000 targets. Abnormally low scores* will be disregarded and an additional score substituted to calculate the average after 1,000 targets. A PITA shooter who has not shot 16 yd targets for one or more years shall resume shooting from their last assigned class unless they have an established ATA classification that is higher.

Doubles—On average beginning with at least 200 PITA doubles targets—then on an increasing total until **800** targets—then on last **800** targets. Abnormally low scores* will be disregarded and an additional score substituted to calculate the average after **800** targets.

Handicap—PITA yardage unless shooter has a current established longer ATA yardage in which case the shooter shall be assigned yardage that is one yard less than their ATA yardage. However, if a shooter has not shot ATA targets in the current and previous 2 years their ATA yardage will be disregarded. A PITA shooter rejoining after an absence of one or more years must resume shooting from their previous yardage unless they have established a greater yardage or have moved from Sub-Junior class due to age.

***Abnormally low scores are those scores 10 targets below your average.**
